Instructions:

Please encourage your child to complete the given worksheets at home to help reinforce the concepts learned in school. We kindly request you to send the completed worksheets along with the creative activities mentioned below in a folder when the school reopens.



LANGUAGE ENRICHMENT: Express with Joy!

- Alphabet Treasure Hunt: Hide letter flashcards around the house. Ask your child to find them and say the word beginning with that letter.
- Rhyme Time: Recite rhymes together like My Red Balloon, Twinkle Twinkle Little star, The New Version of Oranges and Lemons (shared below) and ask simple questions about them.
- Talking Time: Every evening, have a "Talk with Mama/Papa" moment where your child narrates one thing they enjoyed during the day.
- Magic Words Game: Keep a Magic Word jar. Add a star every time your child says "Please," "Thank you," or "Excuse me." Celebrate with a sticker party at the end!





COGNITIVE FUN: Learn Through Play



- Shape Sorting Box: Create a fun sorting game using a shoebox and cutouts of circles, squares, triangles, and rectangles.
- **Colour Hunt**: Pick a colour each day and let your child find 5 items of that colour around the house.
- **Puzzle Play**: Give your child age-appropriate puzzles or jigsaw activities to enhance their problem-solving skills.

PHYSICAL EXPLORATION

- Animal Walks: Pretend to be animals—hop like a bunny, crawl like a tiger, waddle like a duck!
- Balloon Volleyball: Use a balloon and play a gentle indoor volleyball game to build coordination.
- Obstacle Fun: Set up a mini obstacle course using cushions, tunnels (chairs with sheets), and toys.



LIFE SKILLS & SOCIAL EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT



- Little Helper Chart: Make a weekly chart where your child ticks tasks they helped with—watering plants, folding napkins, putting away toys.
- Story Time Sharing: Share one story from your childhood every week. Ask your child what they learned from it.
- My Family Tree: Create a simple family tree with names and photos/drawings of family members. Encourage your child to talk about them.

HEALTH & HYGIENE

- Teach your child to brush twice daily, wash hands before and after meals, and stay hydrated.
- Practice simple yoga poses like butterfly pose, lion's breath, or tree pose.
- Create a "Healthy Eating Rainbow Chart" let your child colour fruits and veggies they eat from different colour groups (red tomato, orange carrot, green spinach, etc.).



ARTISTIC ADVENTURES | CRAFT CORNER

Rainbow Smiles Craft

Materials: Coloured craft paper, glue, scissors, string or wool, black marker or crayon, tape or thread for hanging.


Steps:

- Fold coloured papers in a fan shape to make the rainbow.
- Cut out cloud and sun shapes.
- Stick smiley faces on the clouds and sun using a marker.
- Attach strings with paper raindrops to the bottom of the clouds.

- This activity boosts fine motor skills and lets children express their food preferences in an imaginative way. Get it laminated to use during school mealtimes as a personalized mat!






Special Bonding Activities

- 2. Write "World's Best Dad!" in the centre.




- 3. Attach ribbon or paper strips to the bottom and top (for hanging).
- 4. Let the child colour, stick stars, and decorate as they like.




Pre-Writing Practice




Name: CONNECT THE FRUITS Trace the line to connect the fruits.
